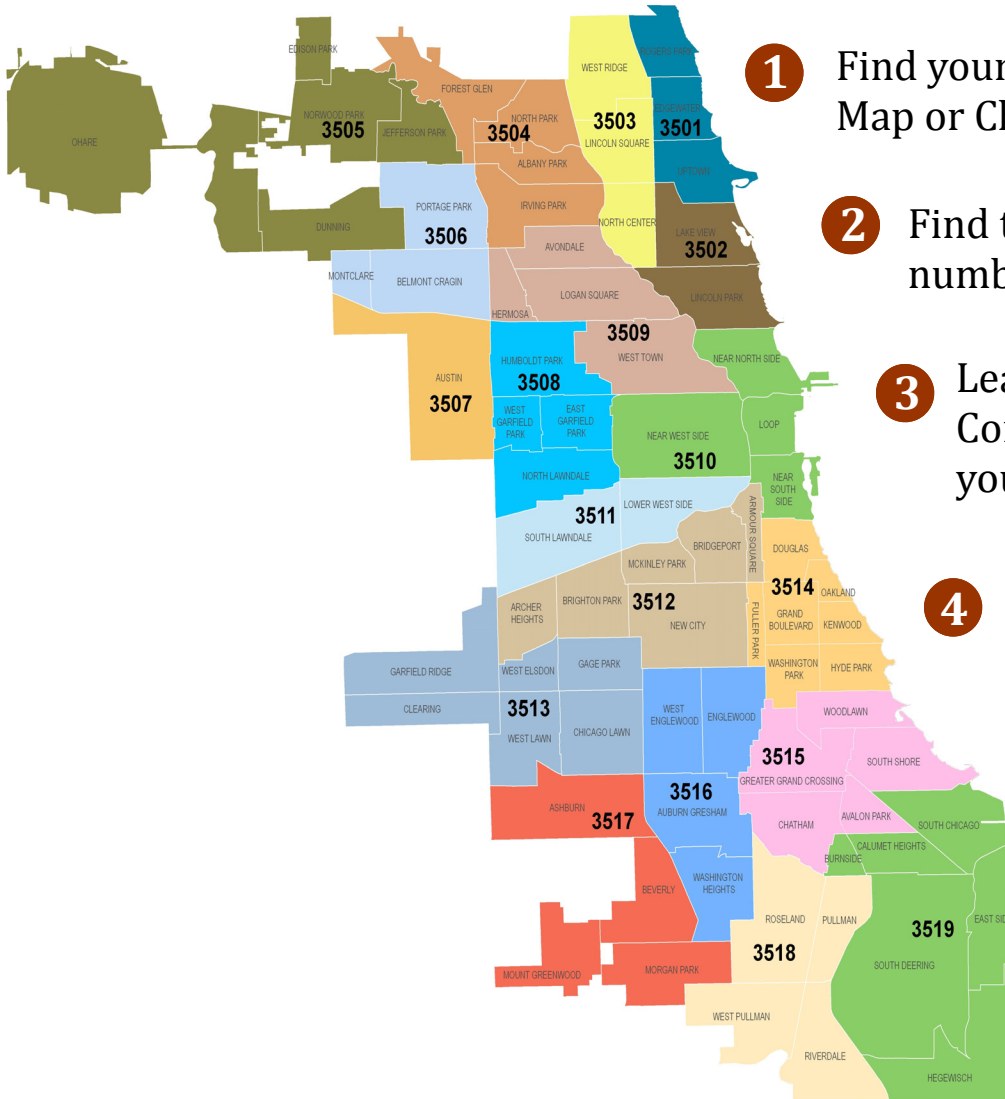


What is a PUMA?

The U.S. Census Bureau's American Community Survey (ACS) includes sample data from statistically-defined areas called Public Use Microdata Areas (PUMA). A PUMA represents the smallest geographic level available in the ACS in between Decennial Census years. There are 19 PUMAs in Chicago which is made up of groups of Chicago Community Areas.
